## **Main Action Items**

### **1. Madrid FIA Proposals**

John elaborated on the Madrid FI Assembly meeting. 23 proposals for sessions to be included in the event programme were received, out of which 7 overarching cross-cutting topics were creating.

The cross-cutting topic most closely aligned with our WG topics is the Management and Governance session. John will propose Alex as a chair of this session. There will be the meeting of the Organising Committee for Madrid on 15<sup>th</sup> of September. Any comments on the document on FIA event sent around by John, are welcome. John will present them at the OC meeting.

Alex: There is a need to define the scope of the Management and Governance session as well as links to other topics.

Mike: There is also a need to establish links with the Networks WG, currently only the management and governance topic looks at convergence issues between services and networks. Mike tried to contact representatives of this group about socio-economic issues without a result (probably due to the fact people are very busy). The current WG structure would be more balanced if the services group had a topic in socio-economics rather than two in Future Internet services offer. We therefore proposed an update to the lifecycles topic so that it is grounded in socio-economic issues. The following actions were identified

- Update the current lifecycles topic to reflect socio-economic issues (Mike)
- Propose amendments to the Madrid structure to include the lifecycles topic in socio-economics (Anne-Marie)

John: As the FIA Madrid Programme is very tight – our WG members may want to split for three streams – to see what is going on.

Anne-Marie: ISI Technology Platform are included in the Madrid event but we have not had so much contact with representatives from this area.

John: Same for me.

Zeta: Authenticity and Trust session. It is to be an umbrella session to cover all related topics. A september workshop will shape the December event.

John: Regarding this session - a contact with Nick and Neeli from the Internet of Things should be established.

Alex: What will be the next steps after the FIA event? What are the main goals?

John: The goal is to discuss the seven cross-cutting topics. Collaboration before and after Madrid will be across these seven topics.

Anne-Marie: The expected outcome is presented in the document sent around. The aim of the Madrid technical workshop is to discuss cross-cutting issues of common interest. The expected outcome would be position statements. In practice, such paper would be maximum 2 pages describing the state of play, research orientations and possible integration paths towards the future internet, accompanied by a roadmap with milestones, to be supported by the attendees.

Bruno: Is there a plenary session to speak about the general goals for the initiative? In Japan Future Internet Initiative, they defined two streams of work including also a global stream – with general goals (not only topic-specific).

**Action item:** Comments on the initial structure and division of sessions for the FIA meeting in Madrid. Interested session leaders to contact Anne-Marie with changes/proposals to the initially proposed sessions. Others please contact John with any comments on the document sent around.

Alex: The session statements should be rather figures/pictures than a white paper.

Anne-Marie: This should be agreed by the session leaders.

John will present comments expressed during the teleconference as well as sent by emails at the OC meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> of September.

## 2. Conference in Lyon
